LEADERSHIP TEAM UPDATE

Hello to all Salem congregants. We hope everyone had a blessed Easter celebration. We welcomed back JoAnn Keister and her family after a lengthy time away.

The Leadership Team met in April and took action on a couple of standing issues. The team focused on the sanctuary roof replacement cost and maintenance concerns. Some background: Galvalume, the product selected, is a steel based roofing product and so is subject to corrosive action. Corrosive effects are offset by a coating alloy of aluminum and tin on the base metal. Corrosive elements are mitigated and industry data approximates a 45 year lifetime, and it comes with a 25.5 year warranty. Approval to move forward, with contracting with a few caveats, was unanimous.

Salem team members met with the Brookeville Historic Committee to review a grant to approve to construct the new metal roof. We have a responsive and responsible bid from Hardin Construction LLC for \$110,000 plus several elements to be priced. Salem is now seeking permitting from the Park and Planning Historic Preservation Committee.

Salem still needs to complete an assessment of the current status of its infrastructure. As said last time, the end result is a triage-type list identifying immediate repairs, repairs that can wait 6 months, and work that can be deferred for a longer interval. And a budget for getting it all accomplished within the list schedule and Salem's resources.

McCarty Commercial Construction has provided Salem with a preliminary sketch of a new sanctuary layout. We are looking into interior design and lighting consultants for ideas on finishes inside. Information has started being disseminated to the congregation.

In other matters, Salem will be offering once monthly Sunday child care starting at 9:15 A.M.

Reverend Emily and Churchill are in contact with Brookeville and Better Angels for common use ideas and lecture series nearing election time, respectively.

Mary Kay and Churchill are integrating QuikBooks software into a new computer to streamline budget reporting.

The March P and L statement shows Salem has over \$6,300 in profit through March. Always welcome news to report.

Olney HELP Food Needs

You may leave non-perishable food donations in the box under the table in the sanctuary or in the marked box in the Community Hall. Most needed items include non-perishable snacks for kids over Spring break, canned fruit (in juice), peanut butter (16 oz, smooth), cold cereal (kids and adult), canned pasta, snacks for kids, pancake mix and pancake syrup. Also, canned fruit (in juice please), canned pasta, shelf stable bottled juice, frosting for all our cake mixes (we provide cake mix, frosting, candles, cupcake holders and sprinkles for the kids birthdays), pancake mix, canned chili, canned chicken, sloppy joe sauce, canned tomatoes (prefer low salt), adult cereal, spaghetti sauce -plain kind, canned meats, such as tuna, chicken, turkey, corned beef, spam, salmon, Vienna sausage, etc.;, 1 lb. bags of rice and rice sides (Knorr/Roni), pasta sides (Knorr/Roni), baked beans, canned green beans, corn, peas (low/no salt), Jelly - all sizes, all flavors, condiments - BBQ sauce, ketchup, mustard, salad dressing; instant mashed potatoes - pouches and boxes, juice boxes for the kids (100% juice please).

You can also drop off Giant gift cards at the Giant Customer Service desk, and they will hold them for Olney Help.


