You see, volunteering for your church and being of service to your community, should ideally give you a chance to deepen your relationship with God through sharing your gifts and talents with God's people. This only happens if there are good boundaries around the service. Both of our goals are about setting healthy boundaries that will make it more fulfilling to be part of our church mission. Over the past year we've noticed that our church's mission (to grow in Christian faith and express God's love through serving others) is beautiful ... but a little bit challenging to carry out. What does it mean to grow in Christian faith? How do we define "serving others"? What does God's love look like? Since this is beautiful without being concrete, it's really hard to establish boundaries around what we do as a church. Any sort of service can be called serving others. Any act of kindness could be God's love. While there's a beauty to the simplicity, it doesn't give us a good filter for deciding what we will and will not do as a church.

One of our goals as a Leadership Team is to tighten our mission statement into something that is unique to Salem and who we are called to be.

When I started at Salem, I kept asking people what it means to be part of Salem. Almost everyone then and since has said Salem is all about community. I'd like to see our mission reflect that.

So, join us in following the Spirit. Where do you think the Holy Spirit is leading us? What are we called to do? Who are we called to be?

Have you ever gotten stuck in a box? No, not like the TV box you played in as a kid. I mean a mental box. Have you ever gotten stuck in thinking life is a series of "this vs. that" or "right vs. wrong" or "my way vs. their way" or "mask vs. no mask" decisions? As if life can be condensed into perfect choices on one track or another! Often, unfortunately, there are no perfect choices. There are shades of grey, nuances, and unknowns that make it hard to even make good choices, let alone perfect ones.

In our Lenten scriptures, we'll see Jesus, his disciples, and the other people around them try to understand that life is more complicated than "this *vs.* that" and living inside our carefully constructed boxes. When Jesus is confronted with two equally poor choices he always rises above and steps out of the box. We are called to do the same. Join us this Lent as we seek to step out of our confining boxes and onto a path of life with God.

If you'd like to go deeper, join us in our Lenten Booklet, "Outside the Box: A Lent of Breaking Free." We will journey through weekly scripture readings, daily practices, and thought-provoking questions as we try to break out of the boxes the world tries to shove us into. If you are tired of division and are looking for a better way, this is the study for you. We will have small group discussions about the weekly readings every Wednesday night on Zoom from 6:30–8:00 P.M. Discussion starts at 7:00 P.M.

Complete the reading for Week One on your own (John 11:1-44). Read the Week Two Scripture (John 13:1-17) for the first group study on March 9.



"Connections" Identity—Beliefs—Impact Thursdays, March 3–April 15 1:00–2:30 P.M.

Join us for a seven-week exploration of what it means to be part of Salem UMC and how we impact the world. Long-time members and first-time explorers welcome.

We will learn basic Christian and United Methodist beliefs, how these are lived out at Salem, and how you can be part of impacting the world with the rest of the body of Christ.

Each session will be 90 minutes to give us time to connect with each other and the material. Weather depending, some sessions will be held at Brookeville Beer Farm. Each first-time explorer will be paired with a church member who will act as a guide and conversation partner throughout the class.

This class will begin Thursday, March 3 and will finish on Easter Sunday, April 17. Anyone who takes the class and wishes to join the church can do so on Easter, just like they did in the ancient church!

DID YOU KNOW?

Why is Purple the Color of Lent?

Tyrian, also known as Royal Purple, was often reserved for the very wealthy and royalty and essentially a status symbol. The Romans placed an extremely high value on the dye as it was extracted from sea snails, therefore not easily obtained.

The Roman soldiers who tortured Jesus during His Passion would've been well-aware of the imperial symbolism behind the color purple. This is why, in mocking Jesus before His crucifixion, the soldiers dressed Jesus in a purple robe and put a crown of thorns on His head, proceeding to then beat Him and yell, "Hail, King of the Jews!" (John 19:2-3).

In a further attempt to humiliate Jesus after the soldiers had removed the purple robe from Him, Pilate had a sign affixed to Jesus' cross inscribed with the words, "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews" (John 19:19). This inscription is memorialized on today's crucifixes by the letters INRI, which are the initials for "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews" in Latin—"lesus Nazarenus, Rex Iudaeorum."
